Lesson Plan

Media: Video (46 minutes) Seat Time: 6 Classes | 300 minutes teaching

Goal:

To gain an understanding of the elements and principles as well as the color schemes associated with basic floral designs.

Description:

This lesson prioritizes comprehending the elements and principles of floral design as they are vital in creating a quality arrangement. This presentation takes a closer look at the elements and principles of floral design. Jim Johnson, Endowed Chair and Distinguished Lecturer of the Benz School of Floral Design at Texas A&M University, breaks down each element and principle of design as well as the color schemes used in floral design.

Objectives:

- 1. To analyze the design elements and principles and their use in floral design.
- 2. To identify the properties of color.
- 3. To apply color schemes to floral designs.

Step 1: Bell Ringer:

The Action Plan lays out a list of tasks for students to complete during the lesson.



- The **Vocabulary Handout** is a list of terms used throughout the lesson.
- The **Key Concepts** is an outline which identifies the main ideas presented in the lesson which students can fill in to aid in note taking during the lesson.

 Step 3: Show the Introduction video segment. This video is 3 minutes long. Be sure students utilize the Key Concepts for this segment of the lesson.
 Step 4: Show the Elements of Design video segment. This video is 11 minutes long. Be sure students utilize the Key Concepts for this segment of the lesson.
 Step 5: Administer the Introduction and Elements of Design Check for Understandings. The Check for Understanding is a short review of the content presented in the segment.
Step 6: Students should complete the Elements of Design 360 Degree View Activity. • Students will watch the Elements of Design 360 Degree View video segment and answer the questions regarding the content.
 Step 7: Exit Ticket: Post true or false statements for students to see and determine the correct answer based on their knowledge. Have students turn in their answers.

 Step 4: Students should begin the Color Wheel Activity. Students will use the color wheel to select a color scheme and create a small arrangement.
