# Developmental Theories Visual

## Project Overview:

In groups of three or four, you will create a visual to illustrate how developmental theories identify and explain human growth, development, learning and behavior for a specific life stage.

## Directions:

1. Your instructor will divide the class into groups of three or four and assign each group one of the following life stages:
  - Infants
  - Preschoolers
  - Middle childhood
  - Adolescents
  - Early adulthood
  - Middle adulthood
  - Late adulthood
2. Using available resources, research further details about different human developmental theories and identify human developmental theories which apply to your assigned life stage.
3. Identify and explain how historical theories influence modern theories of development for your assigned life stage.
4. Label each theory including the name of the theorist. Identify how your chosen theories help explain developmental stages, learning and behavior.
5. Using paper or electronic resources, create a visual to illustrate how developmental theories explain the biological, emotional, social and cognitive development of your assigned life stage.
6. Once complete, submit your project according to your instructor's directions.

  - Overview of the three trimesters
  - Calculating due dates
  - Medical practices prior to and during pregnancy
  - Reasons for medical care prior to and during pregnancy
  - Healthy weight gain
  - Health practices prior to and during pregnancy
  - Proper nutritional needs prior to pregnancy
  - Proper nutrition during pregnancy
  - Quality prenatal care
  - Things to avoid during pregnancy
2. The brochure should consist of at least six panels and be targeted toward first-time pregnant individuals.
3. Attach a citation sheet listing all sources used.
4. Once complete, submit your project according to your instructor's directions.

# Infant Development Timeline

## Project Overview:

You will create a timeline to track infant physical, cognitive, emotional and social development. You will also include an explanation of how developmental theories apply to infant development.

## Directions:

1. Your instructor will divide the class into groups of two to three. You will choose or be assigned one of the following time frames for an infant's first year.
  - Zero to three months
  - Four to six months
  - Seven to nine months
  - Ten to 12 months
2. Using all available resources, research the infant developmental milestones for your assigned time frame in all areas of development: physical, cognitive, emotional and social.
3. In addition, choose one of the developmental theories to further investigate how the ideas relate to infant development:
  - Abraham Maslow - Hierarchy of Needs
  - Jean Piaget - Theory of Cognitive Development
  - Robert Havighurst - Developmental Task Theory
  - Erik Erikson - Eight Stages of Psychosocial Development
4. With your research, create a timeline which includes the following:
  - A title (your assigned time frame)
  - Three developmental milestones in each area of development: physical, cognitive, emotional and social
  - An explanation of how at least four developmental milestones are influenced by an infant's family
  - An explanation of how your chosen developmental theory applies to infant development
  - At least three images or graphics
  - A citation sheet listing any sources used
5. Once complete, submit your project according to your instructor's directions.
